District Communication Efforts

The following was accomplished in parent involvement during the 2010-2011 school year in support of the Washoe County School District's (WCSD) strategic plan, *Envision 2015 – Investing in our Future*. The District's Family-School Partnership Office works in collaboration with the District's Parent Involvement Council to implement district-wide initiatives for family engagement which included:

- Americorps Parent Involvement Facilitators were placed in 12 high schools to positively outreach to the families of 9th grade Risk Index students and support the families to monitor their child's progress through the Infinite Campus Parent Portal.
- Collaborated with Title I to create a data collection system for Parent Involvement Facilitators in the Infinite Campus Student Information System to monitor academic outreach and support to families.
- Placed Parent Portal kiosks in all 94 schools with support materials and external banners.
- Supported schools with 56 trainings for parents on the IC Parent Portal.
- Hosted and produced 29 radio shows on Spanish radio – Radio Innovacion, in collaboration with Diversity & Equity and Team Up 21st Century.
- Provided two professional development sessions for all principals on family engagement.
- Implemented a district-wide Parent Climate Survey aligned with the student and staff survey. Navigated the use of paper surveys to ensure that all parents had an equitable chance of providing input. Collaborated with PIC in the design of the survey questions and the marketing plan.
- Increased the ethnically and racially diverse representation on PIC to fill numerous vacant positions.
- Collaborated with Title I to support the positive Parent Teacher Home Visit Program. The program grew from 3 schools in 2009-2010 to 21 schools in 2010-2011.
- Supported the Superintendent in hosting 7 Brown Bag Lunch's in neighborhoods throughout the Truckee Meadows, with an average attendance of 27 people.
- Worked with PIC and 15 community-based organizations to build the WCSD Parent University to be implemented in 2011-2012. More than 175 classes have been identified and will be included in the catalog.

- Invited and placed parents on the following District committees/events: Diversity & Equity Leadership Team, Accountability Policy, Naming of Schools, Calendar Committee, Teacher Evaluation and the Data Summit.
- Worked with the PIC to rewrite the Parent Involvement Facilitator job description.
- Worked with the PIC to rewrite the family engagement section of the teacher evaluation.
- Collaborated with Title I, Title III, Title VII and Team Up 21st Century to provide 2 sessions of professional development on family engagement for key school site staff.

The Diversity Office hosted Study Circles for teachers, parents and students in which they had conversation about race, ethnicity and student achievement. The Education Alliance was in its fifth year of implementing the five-year, \$3.1 million dollar federal Parent Information & Resource Center (PIRC) statewide grant. Staff members provided services and trainings on research based programs in Reno, Elko and Las Vegas. Infinite Campus Parent Portal kiosks were placed throughout the community in libraries and community locations, providing parents without technology, access to their child's grades and attendance. 51 Parent Involvement Facilitators, funded through Title I grant funds and District funds provide daily support to parents at our most at-risk schools. The PIFs are supported by the District's Title I Office and Family School Partnership Office with professional development on various topics.
