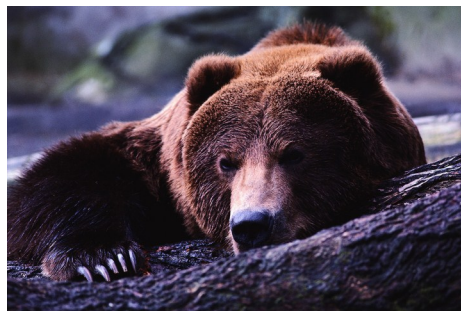

Kicking Off the 2010-2011 School Year

Welcome to the 2011 – 2012 school year. I am excited to get the year started. With great parents, students and staff members, Galena is a wonderful place for kids to come to school. With our changing student body, each year brings different dynamics but I am confident that this group of students will keep Galena among the top high schools in our county and the nation.

As this is the first parent newsletter of the year, I will highlight a few important items that you need to be aware of around the school.

Wednesday Early Release to Continue! Continuing this year, students will be released from school at 1:45 for teacher professional development. These early release days will replace the monthly delayed start days from past years. These early release days will begin August 31st, and continue throughout the school year. Small Schools Model to Continue! Galena will continue with the "Small Schools" model of school organization this year. In this model, one administrator is in charge of each

grade level and one counselor oversees the grade level. Further, all teachers at the school are assigned to a grade level team.

This year, Teresa Burrows will oversee freshmen, David Murdock will oversee Sophomores, Silvia Marin will oversee Juniors and David

Huffmire will oversee Seniors. Each class will also have a counselor: Jay Stuart – Freshmen, Tracy Melcher – Sophomores, Cindy Barnard – Juniors, and Marissa Dunne Seniors. Each grade level administrator/counselor team will handle all activities related to that group of students. If you have any questions about your child's

activities at Galena I would encourage you to call/email the appropriate administrator.

Open House September 14th, 6:00 – 8:30. Finally, coming up in September we have our annual open house. **I would encourage every parent to come up to the school on September 14th, from 6:00 – 8:30, to visit each of your child's classrooms and meet the teachers.** This is a great opportunity to learn about the policies, procedures, and expectations for each class your student is enrolled in this school year.

The first few weeks of a new school year are critical to the success of each student. Please speak with your sons and daughters about their new classes. Ask them about class expectations, homework policies, and what they will be studying in each class. The dialogue you have about the classes will help students better understand their new classes and help them to feel more comfortable and confident as the year progresses.

I am thrilled to be able to serve this community as principal and will do everything I can to keep Galena High School among the elite. I really believe that "It's Good to be a Grizzly!"

Summary of Schedule Change Policies

As the new school year begins, please keep in mind that Galena High School has a schedule/course change policy in place. By working together and adhering to the policy, it allows Galena to offer the best possible courses and curriculum to our students with the resources available to us. Currently, changes to a student's schedule are limited to the following:

- Student has been placed into the wrong level of a subject.
 - Student has already received credit in the course for which enrolled.
 - Student must drop an elective course in order to take one required for graduation or in order to re-take a required course, which was not successfully completed.
 - Student has an incomplete schedule or an over-filled schedule.
- Keep in mind...
- Specific teacher requests can not be honored, please keep this in mind when requesting a schedule change.
 - An AP course may not be dropped from a student's schedule without the student first attempting the course.

Welcome Back Grizzlies! Please stop by and visit with me in the Career Center located inside the Galena Library. In addition to your counselor, I would like for you to consider me as someone who can assist you here at Galena. I am here to help you apply to colleges, apply to the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid), apply for scholarships, research career choices, write resumes, and interview for jobs. I am also a member of the wonderful Library staff, so feel free to come see me for a great book recommendation or help with your research projects.

Please listen carefully to the school's announcements each day, watch for flyers in the hallways, and take a look at Galena's home page so you know what events are upcoming in

the Career Center/Library. We host career presentations, college visits, military visits, and community service opportunity visits. You must obtain an enrichment pass from me to attend these events. Most of our presentations take place during enrichment or lunch.

I am already scheduling college visits. We are hosting Sierra Nevada college on September 16, University of Chicago on September 26, Hampshire College on October 6, Seattle University on September 7, University of Portland on November 3, and on November 7th, Western Washington, Washington State University, and Fort Lewis College.

Counseling Corner

A message from the counselors to all parents' and students':

Hello Grizzlies! Welcome back to the 2011-12 school year. The beginning of the school year is always a very busy time in the counseling office. We are spending every available minute trying to address schedule issues and return all of your emails and messages as quickly as possible. Please understand that our phones and emails are backed up while we work through scheduling concerns and new student enrollment appointments. We might be slow to get back to you but we are not being rude or ignoring you... we are just overwhelmed. Your understanding and patience is greatly appreciated during this time.

A few things to take note of:

You have been given your requests whenever possible. If courses were full, we put you in an alternate course.

If you have changed your mind and want to take something you did not initially sign up for, that might not be possible. Our schedule and many classes are extremely full and there is not room to move classes around.

Scheduling students into the same class period for a course for the entire year is often impossible. You will probably have two or more courses that change to a different period for second semester. Your teacher will stay the same, but the period changes. The teachers have no problem with it and it is unavoidable in an effort to keep class sizes balanced throughout the year.

Also remember, Galena administration does not allow any teacher requests or teacher changes! We also cannot honor period requests.

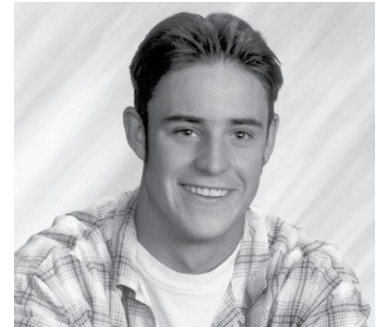

Ricky Woodring, 2/1/81 - 11/16/98

Ricky was 17 years old and a senior at Galena. While on his way home from off campus baseball, a girl reading directions turned left hitting Ricky almost head on. He was a talented baseball pitcher (#35) and a gifted guitar and piano player. Ricky achieved academic success after receiving help with ADD and said he would like to help people like himself one day. Scholarships in his memory benefit athletics, special education and music. Since Ricky's passing, the Ricky Woodring Memorial Fund, through kind donations and the Ricky Woodring/Galena High Golf Tournaments, has made the following contributions:

- 1) \$6,100 to South Reno Babe Ruth for financial scholarships.
- 2) \$18,400 to Galena High School Scholarships: The Ricky Woodring "Heart of Gold" Baseball Scholarship awarded for work ethics and Sportsmanship; The Ricky Woodring Memorial Music Scholarship; The Ricky Woodring Resource Scholarship, awarded to a student with well rounded achievements including academic, in spite of a health impairment or a learning disability.
- 3) \$40,0600 to all Galena Athletic programs. Proceeds helped start the Galena Wall of Fame.
- 4) \$31,560 specifically for the baseball program.
- 5) Ricky was planning a fundraising concert for the baseball program at the time of his accident. His first word was "light" and as a pitcher, he loved night games. The Ricky Woodring Memorial Fund's long term goal is to place lights on the Galena High Baseball Field as a tribute to Ricky's life. We are pleased to announce that the Ricky Woodring Memorial Fund has been able to donate \$26,300 towards lights.

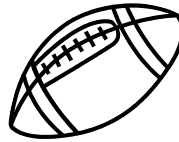
