At Pine Middle School, we follow 4 core values. They are: Be Safe, Be Respectful, Be Responsible, and Be a Problem Solver!

Reminders about our school uniform:

- Students wear khaki or black colored pants. Hemmed **knee length** shorts, skirts, skorts or capris in the same colors are acceptable as well. All must be sized to fit **around the waist** and pants must extend to the top of the shoe. They must be free of holes and slits and cannot be pegged at the bottom or rolled down at the waist. **No denim, sweats or stretchy polyester materials** will be allowed.
- A black or white short/long sleeved polo shirt will be required. **Shirts must be sized to fit**; no oversized/undersized shirts will be allowed. **Shirts must be tucked in at all times while in the building.**
- All clothing with the exception of school purchased clothing must be free of slogans, logos, insignias, brand names, trademarks, messages, gang insignias, wording, pictures, studs, jewels and chains. **Contrasting colors must be worn.**
- Long sleeved sweaters or sweatshirts may be worn **over the polo shirt**. These must be solid colored white, gray or black. The collars of the polo shirt must be clearly visible and worn on the outside of the sweater or sweatshirt.
- Jackets/coats, mittens/gloves, caps/hats and scarves must be removed in the building and stored in your lockers prior to entering classrooms and office buildings. Baseball or baseball style caps are not allowed during the school day (this includes lunch/recess)
- Solid white or black tee shirts/camisoles may be worn underneath the polo shirt. Shirts/camisoles under polos must not be visible. Students also have the option to wear Pine Middle School shirts or sweatshirts earned or purchased through a school activity, sport or club on **Friday's only**.
- If a belt is worn, the belt and belt buckle must adhere to the above restrictions regarding logos, brand names, etc. and must be solid black, brown or white in color. The tail of the belt may not extend more than three inches from the buckle.
- Shoe choices will remain the discretion of students and their parents; however, the WCSD dress code guidelines remain intact. Shoes with soles must be worn. All shoes requiring shoelaces must be laced and tied appropriately. **Only black and white shoelaces will be allowed. No solid red or blue shoes will be allowed.** No slippers, even those with hard soles (ex. Ugg), will be allowed.
- If socks are worn, they must be black, khaki or white in color.
- Accessories such as jewelry and make-up will still be allowed, again in accordance with WCSD dress code policy.
- **Please notice that the uniform code does not mention the allowing of vests.**
